

## **Buying a repairable or damaged vehicle?**

For this reason you want to make sure that if your car has been damaged front first, you get it checked from a mechanic before making any amendments. Engine damage is one of your problems. If your car has been front damaged, you are at risk of having to fix not only the engine but also the radiator, AC, cooling system, brake oil container and much more. Seeing that every important aspect of a car is located at the front, under the bonnet, all these parts are at risk of needed to be repaired if your car has been front damaged. In such cases, you would be better off trading your vehicle rather than fixing it as the cost of repair would have seen you buy a brand new car.
